TRAFFIC IS NO FAIR: AVOID CENTRAL FLORIDA FAIR TRAFFIC WITH 511

TALLAHASSEE – Motorists should expect additional traffic near the Central Florida Fairgrounds beginning this Thursday through Sunday, March 10, as nearly a quarter of a million people are expected to attend the Central Florida Fair during the 11-day period.

With several concerts scheduled as well as amusement rides, entertainers, competitions and more, the fairgrounds likely will be a popular destination during the coming weeks. Drivers should be prepared for increased congestion on S.R. 408 near the Kirkman Road and John Young Parkway exits.

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) encourages drivers heading to or around the fairgrounds to use the 511 Traveler Information System before hitting the road to stay up-to-date on crashes, congestion, construction and more. The 511 system provides information on all of Florida's interstates, toll roads and other major metropolitan roadways, including those near the fairgrounds, such as S.R. 408, I-4 and Florida's Turnpike.

There are four convenient ways for travelers to receive traffic updates, including:

- Calling 511 toll free for updates in English and Spanish.
- Visiting FL511.com, with interactive roadway maps showing traffic congestion, travel times and crashes.
- Downloading the free Florida 511 app on iTunes.
- Following one of the 12 statewide, regional or roadway-specific feeds on Twitter.

For custom alerts, travelers can sign up for My Florida 511 personalized services on FL511.com. Users can register their route online to hear information on that route first when calling 511. With personalized services, travelers also can register to receive traffic alerts via phone call, text message or email.

FDOT reminds all travelers to check 511 before hitting the road, have a passenger check 511 while driving or pull over to avoid distracted driving.

- Public transit, airport and seaport information.
- AMBER, Silver and LEO Alerts (Silver Alerts notify the public when law enforcement agencies are searching for missing adults or citizens with cognitive impairments, including Alzheimer's disease or other forms of dementia. Law Enforcement Officer (LEO) Alerts notify the public when law enforcement officers are searching for an offender(s) who has seriously injured or killed a law enforcement officer.)
- FL511.com provides travel information, traffic camera views and free personalized services, including customized travel routes and e-mail, text and phone call alerts.
- Voice-activated and touch-tone navigation available when calling 511.
- The 511 phone call and FL511.com website are available in English and Spanish.
